

# Certificate required for transportation of body/ashes back to India

## Requirements

Documents	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Passport of the deceased for cancellation</li><li>• Original Death Certificate, with Apostille stamp from DFAT, with one photocopy of the same</li><li>• Original Embalmer's Certificate (or Funeral Parlour Certificate) WITH APOSTILLE STAMP FROM DFAT stating that the body has been embalmed in accordance with the international health and shipping requirements and that the body has been placed in a hermetically sealed container with zinc liner and wooden outer container (not required if ashes are being transported)</li><li>• No Communicable Diseases certificate from the Department of Health stating that the deceased did not suffer from any communicable/contagious diseases (not required if ashes are being transported)</li><li>• Itinerary and details of the person taking body/ashes back to India (if there is someone accompanying the body/ashes)</li><li>• Original Cremation Certificate, with apostle stamp from DFAT, with one photocopy (required only if ashes are being transported)</li><li>• Authorization from family (JP Attached) for transport of body/ashes.</li><li>• <a href="#">Applicable fee</a></li><li>• <a href="#">MISCELLANEOUS SERVICE FORM in Death Cases</a></li></ul>
Note	All documents must be submitted in original along with one set of photocopies
